Isaiah 32: 18

The fruit of righteousness will be peace;

The effect of righteousness will be
quietness and confidence forever.

My people will live in peaceful dwelling places;
in undisturbed places of rest.

Isaiah 33: 5-6

The Lord is exalted, for he dwells on high;
He will fill Zion with justice and righteousness.
He will be the sure foundation for
your times,
A rich store of salvation and wisdom and knowledge;

The fear of the Lord is the <u>key</u> to this treasure.

Isaiah 33: 24

No one living in Zion will say

"I am ill";

and the sins of those who dwell there
will be forgiven.

Isaiah 35: 8-10

And a highway will be there; it will be called the <u>Way</u> of Holiness.

The unclean will not journey on it; It will be for those who walk in that WAY;

Wicked fools will not go about on it.

No lion will be there,

Nor will any ferocious beast get up on it;

They will not be found there.

But only the redeemed will walk there,

And the ransomed of the Lord will return,

They will enter Zion with singing;

Everlasting joy will crown their heads.

Gladness and joy will overtake them,

And sorrow and sighing will flee away.

Dear Friends,

The above scriptures are drawn from the writings of Isaiah the faithful prophet of yesteryear. These scriptures are worthy of our deepest thoughts and meditation because they are as relevant today as in the day that the prophet proclaimed them, because as is says in the scripture "He will be a sure foundation for your time". The prophetic voice is as loud and clear now as it was then. Jesus said "my sheep hear my voice and a stranger they will not follow". God's promise is one that is steadfast and true and he knows his Word commands a blessing. When he said: "hide my word in your heart and sin not", he knows it will benefit us. Jesus said; "My word is truth" and that he was "the way, the truth and the life". To hide the word in your heart is to believe all God said through his prophets and ultimately believe in Jesus as the living Word. How great is the word of the prophet Isaiah when we can believe that God's words can give us strength and understanding. They are not just poetic literature and natural encouragement, but are the wisdom of God. This wisdom is first pure, peace loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit and sincere. Peacemakers who sow this word in peace, raise a harvest of righteousness (James 3: 17-18).

Jesus is made unto us wisdom, righteousness, sanctification and redemption. (1 Corinthians 1: 30). Jesus is the wisdom of God made flesh.

(Isaiah 55: 11-12) God has promised the word of the prophet will not return to him void, but will accomplish what he desires and achieve the purpose for which he sent it.

Every word spoken by a true prophet of God was to herald and exalt the one who had been hidden from the beginning of time.

(1 Corinthians 2: 6-7) ⁶ We do, however, speak a message of wisdom among the mature, but not the wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are coming to nothing. ⁷ No, we speak of God's secret wisdom, a wisdom that has been hidden and that God destined for our glory before time began.

The Lord Jesus Christ is the fulfilment of every prophetic word.

The Apostle Paul wrote explaining that God's people had a zeal for God that was not based on knowledge or in other words was based on the traditions of men.

(Romans 10: 1-11) ¹ Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God for the Israelites is that they may be saved. ² For I can testify about them that they are zealous for God, but their zeal is not based on knowledge. ³ Since they did not know the righteousness that comes from God and sought to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness. ⁴ Christ is the end of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes. ⁵ Moses describes in this way the righteousness that is by the law: "The man who does these things will live by them." ⁶ But the righteousness that is by faith says: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) ⁷ "or 'Who will descend into the deep?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). ⁸ But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the word of faith we are proclaiming: ⁹ That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For it is with your heart

that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved. ¹¹ As the Scripture says, "Anyone who trusts in him will never be put to shame.

And again Isaiah is very bold when he said: "My word has gone out into all the world".

(Romans 10: 20-21) ²⁰ And Isaiah boldly says, "I was found by those who did not seek me; I revealed myself to those who did not ask for me." ²¹ But concerning Israel he says, "All day long I have held out my hands to a disobedient and obstinate people."

<u>The question remains</u>; are we the people of the way or have we returned to the world to receive the evidence of Christ's ruling power? Do we honour God with our lips but our hearts are far from him? Do we accept the praises of men rather than the praise and honour that comes from God only?

Is it to us more important to be member of the "frozen chosen" or to be united in faith (which works by love) into the family or body of Christ. Do we hold unforgiveness and resentment in our hearts that takes root and allows bitterness to nullify God's power in our life. Is our "natural life" the ruling umpire instead of the life of Christ that is full of mercy, grace and love?

Israel had fallen to the demands of the "fallen one" and had allowed the voice of the stranger to nullify the voice of the "risen one".

Adam and Eve listened to the "fallen angel" (Satan) and took on his persona and lived in a fallen state. Men and women today have "fallen" into the trap of the "fallen one" and live for the honour that the world gives. This prestige, money and power nullify the glory, power and honour that should only be given to Christ and his way.

The straight gate and the narrow way are still the road that leads to life and is still the walk commanded by the living Lord. We are to walk in the light as he is in the light.

Through Christ and him alone is the only way that fallen man can rise out of their dead estate. The Lamb of God is the only way and the only one who can take away the sin of the world.

Unless we humble ourselves under the mighty hand of God and meekly trust his way is the right way, we will not inherit what Christ Jesus has gained for us. Only the meek will inherit the earth and only the humble inherit Christ's kingdom.

We need not wait until we are perfect, but by faith receive what Christ has accomplished for us.

Even King David of old becomes a threefold witness of the truth that God is sovereign Lord over all the affairs of heaven and earth.

(Romans 11: 8-10) ⁸ As it is written: "God gave them a spirit of stupor, eyes that they could not see and ears so that they could not hear, to this very day." ⁹ And David says: May their table become a snare and a trap, a stumbling block and a retribution for them. ¹⁰ May their eyes be darkened so they cannot see, and their backs be bent.

So sobering are these words that they can cause us to be like Paul when he preached to the Corinthians.

(1 Corinthians 2: 1-5) ¹ When I came to you, brothers, I did not come with eloquence or superior wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony of God. ² For I resolved to know nothing while I was

with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. ³ I came to you in weakness and fear and with much trembling. ⁴ My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, ⁵ so that your faith might not rest on men's wisdom, but on God's power.

Paul in his humility and weakness knew he was accountable for every word he spoke. In awesome fear of God, he allowed the Holy Spirit to do the work in the hearts of sinful men. He realised his accountability was to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the Kingdom of God and let the wisdom and power of God to work in operation as the Holy Spirit willed.

In this day and age man's natural teachings have diminished the power of God's Spirit and negated the word of God so much that philosophy and psychology now rule from the pulpits and the word is of no effect. They attempt to renovate the old man and deny the power of the new creation. If any man be in Christ he is a new creation, the former way of doing things is gone and it is now a new and living way.

The Holy Spirit can and will work in wondrous ways when we dismount from our "high horses" of denominational superiority, arrogance and pride and let the lamb of God take the sin of the world from our hearts.

God is moving by his Spirit throughout the whole world bringing the knowledge of the glory of God which is revealed in the face of Jesus Christ.

(Zechariah 4: 6) It is not by might, not by power but by my Spirit says the Lord.

God the Father has revealed himself to mankind not as an abstract entity, but has revealed himself to us through his son Jesus Christ. Christ Jesus is alive and will come to us and strengthen us to believe. The only requirement needed from us is to call upon his name. We now have a personal relationship with God through Jesus Christ. When this happens we go from living on shifting sand to being planted upon the rock which is Christ.

(Jeremiah 33: 2-3) ² "This is what the Lord says, he who made the earth, the Lord who formed it and established it – the Lord is his name: (Jesus is Lord). ³ 'Call to me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know.'

Everyone who calls upon the Lord will be saved.

Deliverance from sin and the bondage of corruption is the promise to every man, woman and child in this generation. Don't let pride and unbelief keep you from having a personal relationship with the one who created you and who will redeem you.

Only a fool says in his heart there is no God and the way of a fool seems right to him, but a wise man listens to advice. (Proverbs).

God is continually calling us out of darkness into the light of life and only a fool says "I have made it and have no need of instruction".

The path of the just is as a shining light and it grows brighter and brighter every day.

The instruction and guidance along the narrow way must come from the person that has walked and experienced it. His word is lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path.

Our example and teacher is Jesus and he alone is the one who shunned the broad way and chose the victory path back to the Father.

(Revelation 1: 17-19) Jesus said: ¹⁷ "Do not be afraid. After this he spoke to the ecclesia or called out ones in the city of Ephesus with this promise.
